
ACCORDING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, IN 2021

Victims of Hate Crime Incidents

- 7,074 single-bias incidents involved 8,753 victims
- In 188 incidents, a total of 271 victims were targeted because of more than one bias

Bias Motivation Categories for Victims of Single-bias Incidents in 2021

Disability: 1.7%
Gender Identity: 3.6%
Gender: 1.0%
